

Commitments for the Environment, Climate and Sustainable Development

Please find below the commitments and priorities of the Grand Port Maritime de Guadeloupe to implement a holistic and integrated environmental policy going far beyond the obligations of compliance with current regulation.

In terms of environmental policy, the Grand Port Maritime de Guadeloupe will contribute to a long-term sustainable development, and through restoration activities, go beyond regulatory environmental obligations.

The priorities of this policy concentrate on the restoration of ecosystems, and preservation of land and maritime life with associated environmental effects and impacts on climate adaptation especially with pioneering multi-annual program Cáyoli.

To minimize environmental effect and impact we commit to:

1. Have an appropriate environmental management program that guides and improves our environmental performance, focuses on the protection of the environment, and pays due regard to nature conservation.
2. Keep ourselves informed about, comply with, and as far as it is economically justified, exceed present environmental legislation and other environmental requirements to which we subscribe.
3. Work to prevent environmental incidents and maintain a high level of preparedness to reduce the effects of any incidents that may occur .
4. Use resources as efficiently as possible, and make efforts to reduce the use of energy and raw materials, in order to achieve substantial reductions.
5. In order to contribute to sustainable development, we also monitor our carbon footprint..
6. Influence, specify demands and co-operate with clients, suppliers, authorities and other participants, to fulfil our environmental policy and consult adequately within the local community and relevant organizations on their environmental programs.
7. Demand products and services that in their production, utilization and destruction/recycling minimize the negative environmental effects.
8. Give all employees training on environmental issues and encourage them to actively regard the environment in their daily work.

9. Periodically revise the environmental policy, taking due notice of the results from completed environmental audits and changes in future conditions.
10. Make sure that all necessary resources for the implementation of our environmental policy are allocated.
11. Publish an annual report available to the public.
